Dear Secretary McHugh,

I was grateful to hear the announcement that SGT Bowe Bergdahl was released from Taliban custody and successfully recovered by U.S. Special Operations Forces. However, I am greatly concerned about the method in which his release was secured as well as the circumstances that surround his detention by the Taliban. As the Chairman of the Subcommittee on Military Personnel, I have monitored SGT Bergdahl's situation and fully support the U.S. military's policy of leaving no personnel behind.

Since the time of SGT Bergdahl's disappearance on June 30, 2009, there have been serious allegations made against him. Members of his unit,  $501^{st}$  Infantry Regiment,  $4^{th}$  Brigade Combat Team,  $25^{th}$  Infantry Division, have alleged that SGT Bergdahl deserted while others have gone so far as to accuse him of aiding the enemy. I do not write to accuse SGT Bergdahl of anything; I have no personal knowledge of what occurred on June 30, 2009. However, I do ask that the Army vigorously investigate these allegations via an Article 32 investigation immediately.

I am concerned that officials within the Department of Defense may view SGT Bergdahl's five years in captivity as "time served," for any violation of the Uniformed Code of Military Justice that he may have committed and decide not to investigate the allegations made against him. I would strongly argue against such a course of action because there were six Soldiers: SSG Clayton Bowen, PFC Morris Walker, SSG Kurt Curtiss, 2LT Darryn Andrews, PFC Matthew Martinek, and SSG Michael Murphrey who were killed in action while searching for SGT Bergdahl. I believe that the Army owes it to these fallen Soldiers and their families to investigate exactly what occurred.

Thank you for your prompt attention to this matter. Again, I am relieved that SGT Bergdahl has been recovered safely but I do believe that it is imperative that we fully understand the circumstances in which he came into the custody of the Taliban. I look forward to working with you on this important issue.
