A BILL

To establish the National Commission on the Structure of the Army, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "National Commission

5 on the Structure of the Army Act of 2014".

6 SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS FOR RE-

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DUCTIONS TO THE ARMY NATIONAL GUARD.

8 (a) AIRCRAFT.—None of the funds authorized to be9 appropriated by this Act or otherwise made available for

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fiscal year 2015 for the Army may be used to divest, re tire, or transfer, or prepare to divest, retire, or transfer,
 any aircraft of the Army assigned to units of the Army
 National Guard as of January 15, 2014.

5 (b) PERSONNEL.—None of the funds authorized to 6 be appropriated by this Act or otherwise made available 7 for fiscal year 2015 for the Army may be used to reduce 8 personnel below the authorized end strength levels of 9 350,000 for the Army National Guard as of September 10 30, 2014.

11 SEC. 3. NATIONAL COMMISSION ON THE STRUCTURE OF 12 THE ARMY.

(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established the National Commission on the Structure of the Army (in this
Act referred to as the "Commission").

16 (b) Membership.—

17 (1) COMPOSITION.—The Commission shall be18 composed of eight members, of whom—

19 (A) four shall be appointed by the Presi-20 dent;

(B) one shall be appointed by the Chairman of the Committee on Armed Services of
the Senate;

1	(C) one shall be appointed by the Ranking
2	Member of the Committee on Armed Services of
3	the Senate;
4	(D) one shall be appointed by the Chair-
5	man of the Committee on Armed Services of
6	the House of Representatives; and
7	(E) one shall be appointed by the Ranking
8	Member of the Committee on Armed Services of
9	the House of Representatives.
10	(2) APPOINTMENT DATE.—The appointments of
11	the members of the Commission shall be made not
12	later than 90 days after the date of the enactment
13	of this Act.
14	(3) Effect of lack of appointment by Ap-
15	POINTMENT DATE.—If one or more appointments
16	under subparagraph (A) of paragraph (1) is not
17	made by the appointment date specified in para-
18	graph (2), the authority to make such appointment
19	or appointments shall expire, and the number of
20	members of the Commission shall be reduced by the
21	number equal to the number of appointments so not
22	made. If an appointment under subparagraph (B),
23	(C), (D), or (E) of paragraph (1) is not made by the
24	appointment date specified in paragraph (2), the au-
25	thority to make an appointment under such subpara-

graph shall expire, and the number of members of
 the Commission shall be reduced by the number
 equal to the number otherwise appointable under
 such subparagraph.

EXPERTISE.—In 5 (4)making appointments 6 under this subsection, consideration should be given 7 to individuals with expertise in reserve forces policy. 8 (c) PERIOD OF APPOINTMENT; VACANCIES.—Mem-9 bers shall be appointed for the life of the Commission. Any 10 vacancy in the Commission shall not affect its powers, but shall be filled in the same manner as the original appoint-11 12 ment.

(d) INITIAL MEETING.—Not later than 30 days after
the date on which all members of the Commission have
been appointed, the Commission shall hold its first meeting.

17 (e) MEETINGS.—The Commission shall meet at the18 call of the Chair.

(f) QUORUM.—A majority of the members of the
Commission shall constitute a quorum, but a lesser number of members may hold hearings.

(g) CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR.—The Commission shall
select a Chair and Vice Chair from among its members.
SEC. 4. DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION.

25 (a) STUDY.—

1	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Commission shall un-
2	dertake a comprehensive study of the structure of
3	the Army to determine the proper force mixture of
4	the active component and reserve component, and
5	how the structure should be modified to best fulfill
6	current and anticipated mission requirements for the
7	Army in a manner consistent with available re-
8	sources and estimated future resources.
9	(2) Considerations.—In considering the
10	structure of the Army, the Commission shall give
11	particular consideration to evaluating a structure
12	that—
13	(A) meets current and anticipated require-
14	ments of the combatant commands;
15	(B) achieves a cost-efficiency balance be-
16	tween the regular and reserve components of
17	the Army, taking advantage of the unique
18	strengths and capabilities of each, with a par-
19	ticular focus on fully burdened and lifecycle cost
20	of Army personnel;
21	(C) ensures that the regular and reserve
22	components of the Army have the capacity
23	needed to support current and anticipated
24	homeland defense and disaster assistance mis-
25	sions in the United States;

1 (D) provides for sufficient numbers of reg-2 ular members of the Army to provide a base of 3 trained personnel from which the personnel of 4 the reserve components of the Army could be 5 recruited;

6 (E) maintains a peacetime rotation force 7 to support operational tempo goals of 1:2 for 8 regular members of the Army and 1:5 for mem-9 bers of the reserve components of the Army; 10 and

(F) maximizes and appropriately balances
affordability, efficiency, effectiveness, capability,
and readiness.

14 (b) REPORT.—Not later than February 1, 2016, the 15 Commission shall submit to the President and the con-16 gressional defense committees a report which shall contain 17 a detailed statement of the findings and conclusions of the Commission as a result of the study required by subsection 18 19 (a), together with its recommendations for such legislation 20 and administrative actions it may consider appropriate in 21 light of the results of the study.

22 SEC. 5. POWERS OF THE COMMISSION.

(a) HEARINGS.—The Commission may hold suchhearings, sit and act at such times and places, take such

testimony, and receive such evidence as the Commission
 considers advisable to carry out this Act.

3 (b) INFORMATION FROM FEDERAL AGENCIES.—The
4 Commission may secure directly from any Federal depart5 ment or agency such information as the Commission con6 siders necessary to carry out this Act. Upon request of
7 the Chair of the Commission, the head of such department
8 or agency shall furnish such information to the Commis9 sion.

(c) POSTAL SERVICES.—The Commission may use
the United States mails in the same manner and under
the same conditions as other departments and agencies of
the Federal Government.

14 (d) GIFTS.—The Commission may accept, use, and15 dispose of gifts or donations of services or property.

16 SEC. 6. COMMISSION PERSONNEL MATTERS.

17 (a) COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS.—Each member of the Commission who is not an officer or employee of the 18 Federal Government shall be compensated at a rate equal 19 to the daily equivalent of the annual rate of basic pay pre-20 21 scribed for level IV of the Executive Schedule under sec-22 tion 5315 of title 5, United States Code, for each day (in-23 cluding travel time) during which such member is engaged 24 in the performance of the duties of the Commission. All members of the Commission who are officers or employees 25

of the United States shall serve without compensation in
 addition to that received for their services as officers or
 employees of the United States.

4 (b) TRAVEL EXPENSES.—The members of the Com-5 mission shall be allowed travel expenses, including per 6 diem in lieu of subsistence, at rates authorized for employ-7 ees of agencies under subchapter I of chapter 57 of title 8 5, United States Code, while away from their homes or 9 regular places of business in the performance of services 10 for the Commission.

- 11 (c) STAFF.—
- (1) IN GENERAL.—The Chair of the Commission may, without regard to the civil service laws
 and regulations, appoint and terminate an executive
 director and such other additional personnel as may
 be necessary to enable the Commission to perform
 its duties. The employment of an executive director
 shall be subject to confirmation by the Commission.

(2) COMPENSATION.—The Chair of the Commission may fix the compensation of the executive
director and other personnel without regard to chapter 51 and subchapter III of chapter 53 of title 5,
United States Code, relating to classification of positions and General Schedule pay rates, except that
the rate of pay for the executive director and other

personnel may not exceed the rate payable for level
 V of the Executive Schedule under section 5316 of
 such title.

4 (d) DETAIL OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES.—Any
5 Federal Government employee may be detailed to the
6 Commission without reimbursement, and such detail shall
7 be without interruption or loss of civil service status or
8 privilege.

9 (e) PROCUREMENT OF TEMPORARY AND INTERMIT-10 TENT SERVICES.—The Chair of the Commission may pro-11 cure temporary and intermittent services under section 12 3109(b) of title 5, United States Code, at rates for individ-13 uals which do not exceed the daily equivalent of the annual 14 rate of basic pay prescribed for level V of the Executive 15 Schedule under section 5316 of such title.

16 SEC. 7. TERMINATION OF THE COMMISSION.

17 The Commission shall terminate 90 days after the18 date on which the Commission submits its report under19 section 4.

20 SEC. 8. FUNDING.

Amounts authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 22 2015 and available for operation and maintenance for the 23 Army as specified in the funding table in section 4301 of 24 the fiscal year 2015 National Defense Authorization Act

- 1 may be available for the activities of the Commission
- $2 \quad {\rm under \ this \ Act.}$
